## Paper 1: Shakespeare and the Nineteenth Century Novel

### What's assessed

#### Section A – Macbeth (Shakespeare)

Extract based question

Link themes/ideas/character in extract with the play as a whole

#### Section B – The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll & Mr Hyde (Stevenson)

Extract based question

Link themes/ideas/character in extract with the play as a whole

### How it's assessed

- Written exam: 1 hour 45 minutes
- 64 marks
- 40% of GCSE

### Questions

**Section A Shakespeare:** students will answer one question on their play of choice. They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the play and then to write about the play as a whole.

**Section B The 19th-century novel:** students will answer one question on their novel of choice. They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the novel and then to write about the novel as a whole.

## Paper 2: Writers' Viewpoints and Perspectives

### What's assessed

#### Section A – An Inspector Calls

Choice of two essay questions (students only complete one)

#### Section B – Power & Conflict Poetry

One of fifteen poems is provided and students compare to the anthology poem of their choice

#### Section C – Unseen Poetry

2 questions, analysing 2 poems that have not previously been studied

### How it's assessed

- Written exam: 2 hour 15 minutes
- 80 marks
- 50% of GCSE

### Questions

**Section A Modern texts:** students will answer one essay question from a choice of two on their studied modern prose or drama text.

**Section B Poetry:** students will answer one comparative question on one named poem printed on the paper and one other poem from their chosen anthology cluster.

**Section C Unseen poetry:** Students will answer one question on one unseen poem and one question comparing this poem with a second unseen poem.

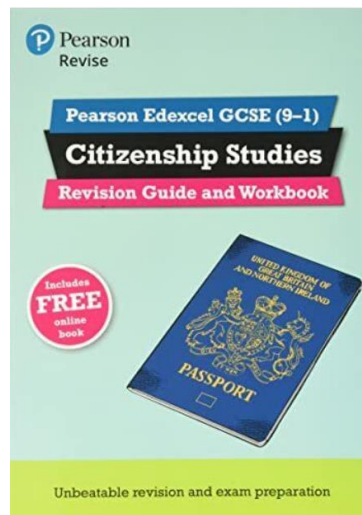
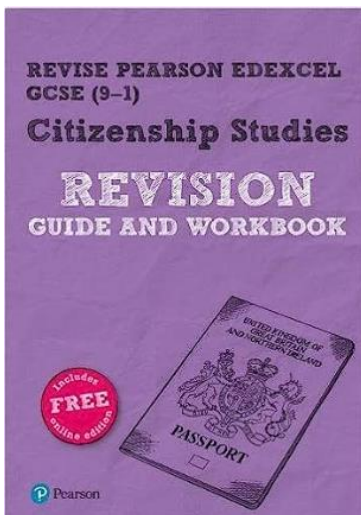
Pupils have all been provided with a revision guide on loan from the school.

(must be submitted to Miss Haynes 48 hours before the exam)



<b>Leah</b>	A moral character who worries about the groups actions. She is insecure and seeks Phil’s attention
<b>Phil</b>	Phil is a controlling character and the leader for the majority of the play. He is emotionless, quiet and manipulative
<b>Jan &amp; Mark</b>	Act as narrators who explain what is happening. They are always together and help in the cover up.
<b>Richard</b>	He first appears to be a strong character and potentially someone who is able to be a leader of the group.
<b>Lou</b>	She worries about the group getting caught. She follows whoever is in charge.
<b>Cathy</b>	A violent and remorseless character, she helps to kill Adam after he reappears
<b>Brian</b>	The weakest member of the group. He is bullied into covering up Adam’s death and suffers a mental breakdown as a result.
<b>Adam</b>	Bullied by the group and is thought to be dead. When he turns out to be alive, Phil has him killed.
<b>Danny</b>	Danny is a strait-laced worrywart who fears that his involvement in his friends’ actions will derail his future.

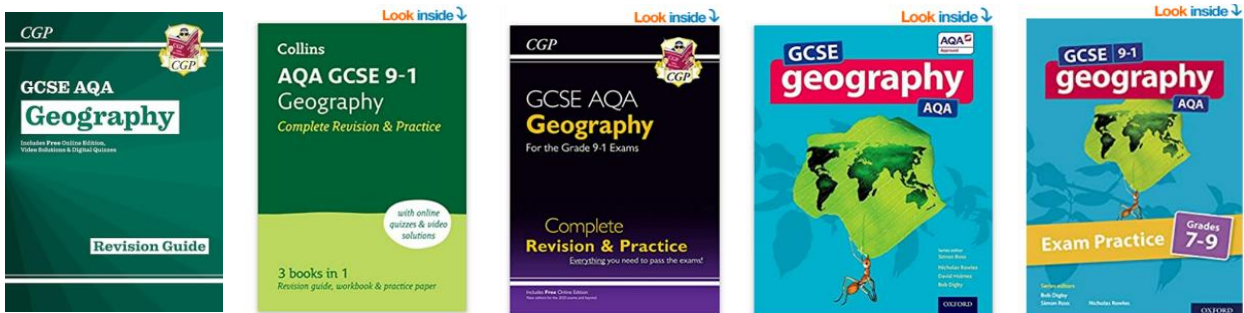

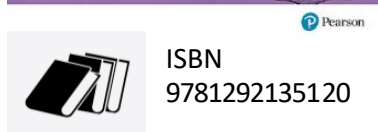
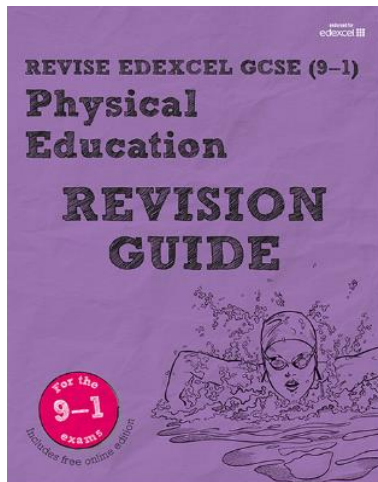
